
Q1 Highlights

- Total revenues came in on top of budget Net Tuition & Fees were \$17.7M lower than budgeted Sales of Goods & Services, Grants & Contracts, State Appropriations, and All Other Revenue exceeded budget by a combined \$17.6M Total expenses came in \$1.5M under budget Personnel Costs exceeded budget by \$2.4M Maintenance & Operations Costs, Scholarships, Exemptions & Financial Aid and All Other Expenses came in a combined \$3.9M under budget Total transfers came in \$20M over budget **Expectations for the Remainder of Fiscal Year 2025** Tuition & fee revenue could continue to see pressure as the year progresses if
 - spring and summer follow fall tuition and enrollment trends. Expenses on track to meet budget and transfers are expected to exceed budget. Net contribution to the fund balance projected to be negative at year-end.


Q1 Comparison Across Fiscal Years (Unaudited)




Fall Enrollment Comparison (Headcount)




Q1 Actuals to Budget Analysis: Revenues

- 01/09/2025 Payment Deadline (Spring and 8 Week 1 Registration)
- 01/12/2025 Last day for 100% tuition adjustment if withdrawing from Spring or 8 Week 1
- 01/13/2025 Spring and 8 Week 1 classes begin
- 01/18/2025 Census Date for 8 Week 1
- 01/25/2025 Census date for Spring semester
