Moody's Outlook:

March 18, 2025



- Moody's is a global credit rating agency
- Potential changes with implications:
 - Cuts to research funding
 - Enforcement action against diversity programs
 - Staff reductions at the US Dept of Education
 - Uncertainty over federal student aid
 - Possible expanded taxes on endowments
 - Potential for reductions/ eliminations of visas for international students
 - Volatile macroeconomic conditions are presenting greater challenges

Legislative Update

Texas Legislative Update:



- Emily Deardorff – AVC, Gov’t Relations, spoke at Dean’s council in early April
- Senate and House drafts are similar:
 - \$211.8M – GR in Senate draft (net of CCAP)
 - \$211.1M – GR in House draft (net of CCAP)
 - \$253.0M – current GR in FY24/ FY25 biennial appro (net CCAP)
- Not finalized, but holding steady through drafts
- Legislative session ends late May/ early June

Texas Legislative Update:



- Concerns:
 - State appropriations used for salary include benefits cost
 - ie. \$100 appropriation salary sourcing is equivalent to \$130 in local funds
 - Biennial funding – 2 years

FY26 Budget/ Transformation Update -2



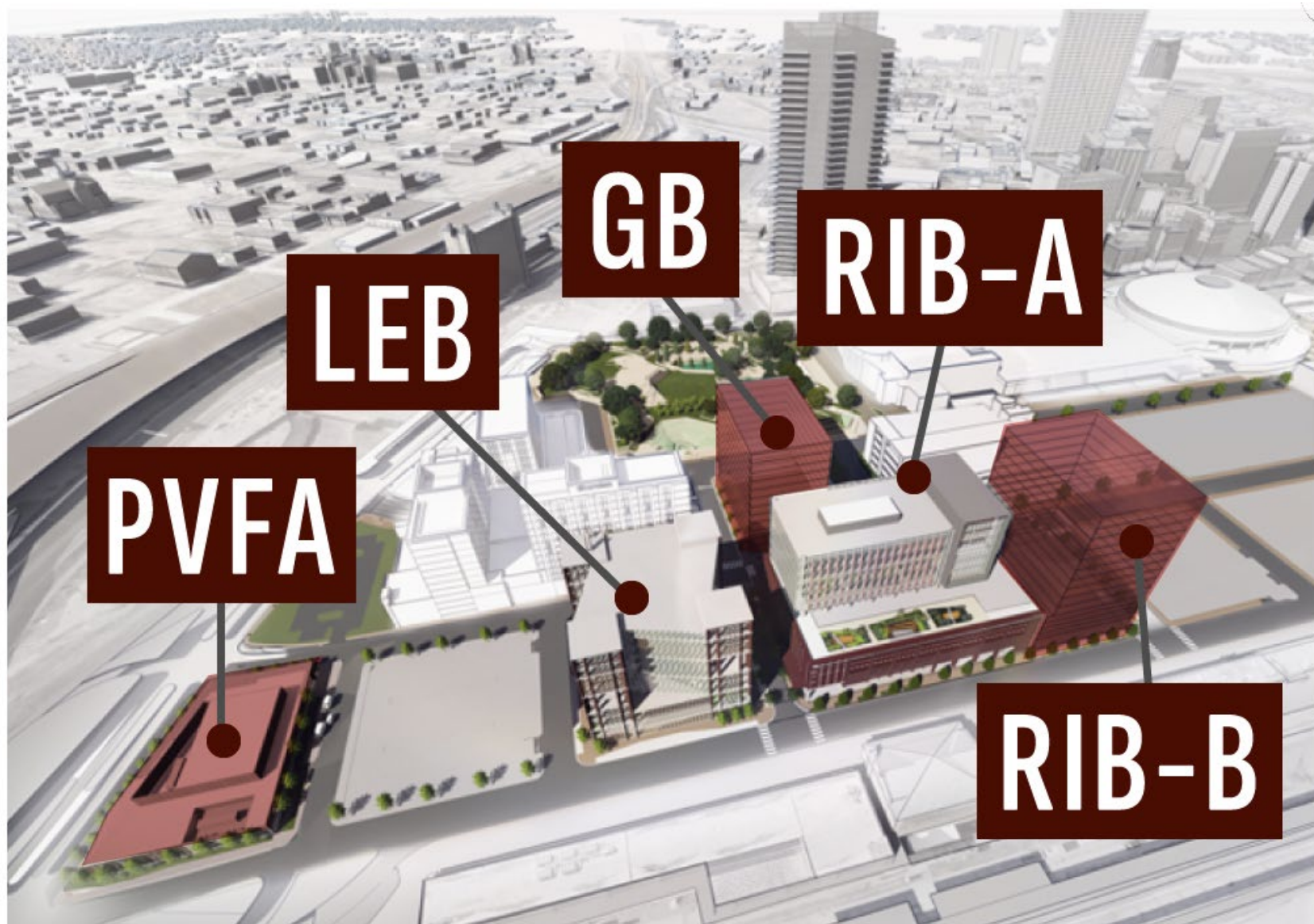
- Factors impacting FY26 budget
 - Enrollment cliff - roughly 2008 recession plus 18 years
 - International student enrollment declines
 - Lower State appropriation
 - Lower percent of high school graduates attending college/
participating in work force
 - Incr competition due to financial aid support from UT System
 - Government decisions affecting grant funding, indirect support,
financial aid, ability to administer, immigration

Texas Education Code § 51.3525



Overview:

- Since, October 2024 – UIC overview of the statute
 - *Continued* intense scrutiny by the Legislature
 - University's risk tolerance *remains* very low
 - Penalties *continue* to be severe, including disciplinary actions by the university against individuals and loss of state funding for UNT

Prohibited Activities



- Promoting differential treatment or providing special benefits to individuals on the basis of race, color, or ethnicity
- Promoting policies designed in reference to race, color, or ethnicity
- Conducting training or activities designed in reference to race, color, ethnicity, gender identity, or sexual orientation
- Compel, require, induce, or solicit a person to provide a diversity, equity, and inclusion statement
- Require participation in diversity, equity, and inclusion training

Exceptions



- (1) **academic course instruction**
- (2) **scholarly research or a creative work** by an institution of higher education's students, faculty, or other research personnel or the dissemination of that research or work
- (3) an activity of a **student organization registered** with or recognized by an institution of higher education
- (4) **guest speakers** or performers on short-term engagements
- (5) a policy, practice, procedure, program, or activity to **enhance student academic achievement or postgraduate outcomes** that is designed and implemented without regard to race, sex, color, or ethnicity
- (6) **data collection**
- (7) **student recruitment or admissions**

Texas Education Code § 51.3525



Awareness:

- Scholarships
- Disbursement Funds/ Other Funding
- Registered Student Organization Funding

Ask questions:

- Is the activity impacted by SB17?
- Generally, does the activity give preference?
- Discuss the activity with your supervisor

Remember:

- Activities are fact-specific, and determinations vary

Scholarships



Potentially Prohibited Criteria:

- All qualified applicants must provide a **500-word essay demonstrating their commitment to diversity, equity, and inclusion**
- **Preference** will be given to **female students** enrolling full-time in any of the College of Business Doctoral programs
- Applicants must be a member of the **India Students Association**
- **Preference** will be given to active members of **UNT Chinese Students and Scholars Association**
- Applicants must be **actively working** on a service **project** focused on issues related to **racial justice and equality**

Disbursement of Gifts/ Other Funding



Potentially Prohibited Criteria:

- \$1,000 pledge payment will go toward a fund for **student travel** for members of the **National Association of Black Journalists**
- \$2,000 **partnership opportunity** to sponsor **Women in Sports and Events** initiatives
- \$5,000 **grant obligation** to a Diversity Scholars Program for **minorities only**

Registered Student Organizations



Funding

- Applied generally and equally to all
 - Student leaders' discretion
- Directed to a specific event
 - All activities associated with the event must be permissible

Texas Education Code § 51.3525

Annual Physical Inventory Certification



Important Dates: May 1 - July 31

- Certification Period:**

The annual physical inventory certification will begin on **May 1** and must be completed no later than **July 31**.

- Key Reminder:**

A common issue each summer is that faculty often don't submit photos of their devices because they're "not working." To avoid delays, **faculty should check in with their inventory coordinators before the summer begins** to ensure all assets are properly documented and certified.

- State of Texas Requirement:**

Please note, **inventory certification is a requirement set by the State of Texas.**
