Bond Issuance



- \$325M bond issuance the last week of April 2025
 - Roughly \$91M of 2015 bonds re-financed
 - Roughly \$234M of new/ CP replacement funding
 - Aggregated true-interest-cost (TIC): 4.213%

Work Orders:

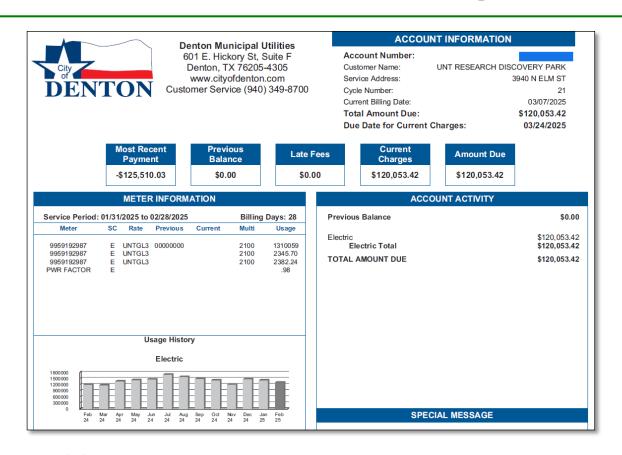
- We identified duplicate lines in the flat file that could result in overcharges.
- Paused billing and conducted a full review of the file to ensure billing accuracy.

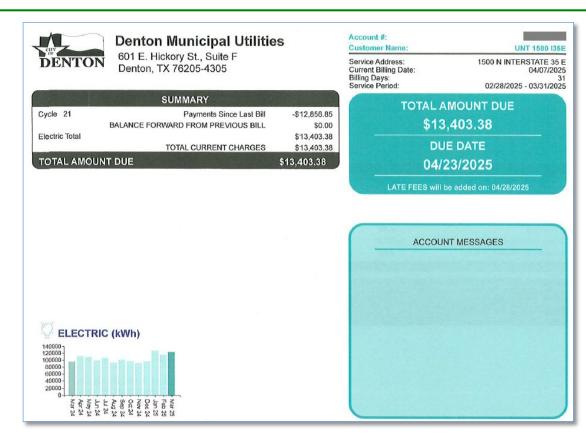
Utilities:

Delegations



What is Delegation?

- Delegation is when a person authorizes another to serve as their representative for a particular task of
 responsibility. With a Delegation, an employee can authorize another employee at the same level or higher
 to perform managerial tasks on their behalf by delegating authority to initiate or approve managerial
 transactions. Delegation of authority to perform managerial transactions is usually prompted by one of
 these scenarios:
 - A manager takes leave and wants to delegate authority of managerial transactions to another person while away from the office.
 - A senior executive does not have the time to process transactions and wants to delegate this authority to another person.

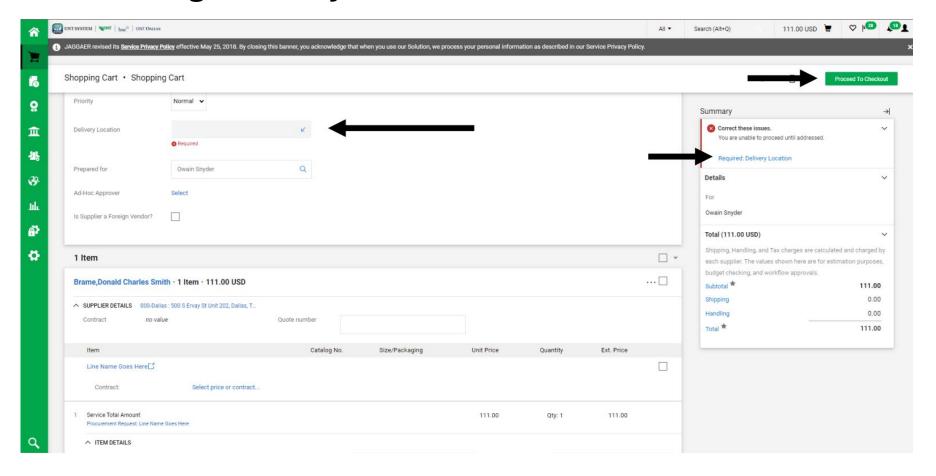
