Budget Transformation Update



- Financial models generated by Technical Committee for review by Steering Committee
- Nov 18 decision on recommendation
 - Recommendation write up in process
 - Subject to Executive Committee acceptance/ rejection
- 5 informational Town Halls conducted; roughly 330 participants
- Consultant Input
- For FY26 budgeting:
 - 5 year template will be provided for input
 - If merit budgeted, will be at a unit level not centrally
 - Budget Office to revise timeline & instructions due to new model






1. Recommended changes to expenditure study methodology

The 2026-27 Formula Advisory Committee recommended that the matrix weights be calculated compared to a base expenditure per SCH rate rather than compared to the cost of a Lower Level Liberal (LLLA) SCH. The methodology sets the base rate at the average expenditure per SCH for the LLLA from FY 2018-FY2022. By comparing expenditure levels for each program/level to a set base expenditure rate, the LLLA weight will be able to increase (or decrease) from 1.0 depending on the actual change in expenditures (unlike the previous methodology, that always maintain the rate at 1.0).

Formula Funding Recommendations for the 2026-27 Biennium - April 2024





2. Recommended changes to formula; the model includes:

- Certified semester credit hour data for the spring and summer of 2024 and error free data for the fall of 2024;
- Expenditure study weights run according to the recommended methodology;
- Three-year average at-risk degrees awarded at Comprehensive Regional Universities;
- Three-year average total research expenditures for the Texas Research University Fund;
- Three-year average federal and private research expenditures and three-year average research doctorates for the National Research Support Fund;
- Three-year average federal and private research expenditures for the Comprehensive Research Fund;
- Predicted square feet from the FY 2023 Space Model;
- Utility adjustment factors;
- Texas A&M University at Galveston shipboard operations inventory;
- Fall 2024 preliminary headcount;
- Veterinary medicine and law tuition data; and
- Disaggregated total semester credit hours between resident and nonresident students based on tuition status from Fall 2023 to Fall 2024 for LBB tuition estimating.

 Additionally, the group considered that if there are no changes to the HEF formula or amount, 20 of the 31 HEF institutions would lose funding compared to current levels. This is a result of certain institutions' increased enrollment driving increases in the metrics used for the allocations, coupled with declines seen at smaller, primarily rural institutions in the state, plus the addition of two new institutions of higher education becoming eligible for HEF appropriations, thereby splitting the funds across a larger base.

Year End Highlights

UNT closed fiscal year 2024 with a \$50.5M favorable impact to fund balance, which is \$48.2M greater than budgeted

- Total revenues exceeded budget by \$57M
- Net Tuition & Fees and State Appropriations were \$6.8M and \$3.7M lower than budgeted, respectively
- Sales of Goods & Services, Grants & Contracts, and All Other Revenue exceeded budget by a combined \$67.4M
- Total expenses exceeded budget by \$30M
- Personnel Costs (\$11.8M), Maintenance & Operations Costs (\$8.3M) & Scholarships, Exemptions & Financial Aid (\$11.1M) all exceeded budget
- All Other Expenses came in \$840K under budget
- Total transfers came in \$21M under budget




